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#### **AUTHOR'S PRODUCTION NOTES**

Mime Time was developed when we needed to entertain a variety of audiences. It has found appeal among young and old. It has been performed in churches, schools, in the mall and on the street. It is a collection which travels well and has been used often in competition with consistent success.

Mime Time uses the classic combination of comic and straight actor to provide a simple conflict. Our audiences seem to respond better to mime skits which contain complete stories — a resolved conflict.

Use the suggested skits with any mime — beginner or advanced — who wants to entertain. Begin by reading through the entire script, then add action and movement. Limit the sets, because elaborate ones can distract the audience's attention from the mime. Don't be afraid to add your own character interpretation. A mime is only convincing when he allows the audience to see life through his own eyes. Exaggerate, examine, exclaim and enjoy!

#### SPECIAL NOTE TO TEACHERS OR DIRECTORS

All mime skits are to be performed without props. The only item on stage is a chair or stool as indicated in the scene of each skit. Encourage your mimes to be individuals. If they have an idea for something to be added to the skit, let them try it. The best ideas always come from working out the details of any mime scene. Be creative. The most important thing to remember in all of the following skits is to find fun in what you are doing. If you enjoy yourself, your pantomiming will be entertaining. Have fun!

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4.	SEE HOW THEY RUN (a story of joggers in search of adventure, for two female mimes and one male mime)

3	SCENE: In front of an empty frame representing a mirror.
4	The mirror should be Down Center so the mime faces
5	the audience to look into the mirror. Also, you'll need
6	a real stool for mime to sit on during make-up
7	application.
8	CHARACTERS: GLAMOUR GIRL, a well-dressed, stylish
9	young lady
10	TOMBOY, a girl who would rather not
11	pay any attention to dress or appearance
12	
<b>13</b>	GLAMOUR GIRL enters and begins to look at
14	herself in the mirror, facing the audience. She is
15	pleased with what she sees, but she puts corrective
16	touches on make-up and hair.
17	TOMBOY enters and walks to the mirror, but
18	not to look at herself; she just wants to wash her
19	hands. She turns on the water, full force. It splashes
20	GLAMOUR GIRL. TOMBOY apologizes and tries to
21	wipe water off of her victim, but only makes her
22	more angry. GLAMOUR GIRL turns on the water
23	and splashes TOMBOY. This action, however, fails to
<b>24</b>	bother TOMBOY. TOMBOY motions to her own face
25	and hair and shows GLAMOUR GIRL she is not
26	bothered, because she is not wearing make-up.
27	GLAMOUR GIRL shows an expression of sadness and
28	apologizes to TOMBOY. She offers to apply make-up
29	to TOMBOY to make amends for the incident.
30	TOMBOY accepts the offer.
31	GLAMOUR GIRL unzips her purse and begins
32	to remove the tools necessary for the job. TOMBOY
33	watches in wonder; her eyes widen and she turns to
34	leave. GLAMOUR GIRL grabs her arm and sits

TOMBOY on the stool, facing Stage Right, as

GLAMOUR GIRL faces Stage Left. TOMBOY looks to the side and can face the audience as she looks in the mirror. GLAMOUR GIRL picks up a brush and brushes hair from face of TOMBOY to prepare for make-up application.

She returns the brush to the counter and picks 6 7 up a small bottle. She shakes the bottle as TOMBOY 8 leans forward on her stool to watch the procedure. 9 GLAMOUR GIRL opens the bottle, puts a small 10 amount of liquid on one index finger. She dots this onto face of TOMBOY and blends over entire face 11 12 and neck. TOMBOY looks into the mirror and back at GLAMOUR GIRL as she shakes her head. 13

14GLAMOUR GIRL shakes her head and begins15to apply eye make-up. TOMBOY manages to wiggle16and gets something into her eye. She makes a fist17and rubs her eye as she frowns. GLAMOUR GIRL18grabs TOMBOY'S hand, cleans up the damage and19begins work on the eye again, holding TOMBOY'S20chin.

21 Next is lipstick. GLAMOUR GIRL shows 22 TOMBOY how to hold her lips for the application. 23 TOMBOY looks into the mirror and thinks this is very funny. She makes faces at herself until 24 25 GLAMOUR GIRL again grabs her chin for the 26 application. TOMBOY manages to get some of the 27 lipstick into her mouth and makes a big fuss over 28 the bad taste.

29The next step is application of powder. This30causes TOMBOY to cough and choke. She turns to31look in the mirror, but GLAMOUR GIRL is not32ready for the final look. She picks up the brush and33arranges TOMBOY'S hair. She is satisfied with her34work, and steps back and smiles. Then she motions35with her hand for TOMBOY to look into the mirror.

TOMBOY looks with disbelief at the new image. She points to herself and shakes her head. GLAMOUR GIRL smiles and also looks into the mirror as she nods her head in approval. GLAMOUR GIRL and TOMBOY look at each other, shake hands and pick up the make-up tools together. They place the items in the purse. They move to the door, and then stop for one last look. GLAMOUR GIRL and TOMBOY look at the audience, and then into the mirror, smile, bow their heads and turn to exit from the stage. (This can be done with two boys who pretend to be girls for a very comic mime.) 

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
