PRODUCTION NOTES

TIME: Late summer and fall, 1820.

SETTING: The town of Sleepy Hollow along the Hudson River in New York State. A representational setting is ideal, with two "buildings" free-standing: at Left a house, representing the Van Tassel farm; at Right the schoolhouse. They should be big enough to hide behind. Against the back curtain we see free-standing pine trees, haystacks, and cornshucks neatly gathered beneath a full moon. NOTE: The play should move smoothly, with no scene changes. The townspeople move the necessary furnishings about as required.

CHARACTERS: Ten male, eleven female. Doubling of children and townspeople can reduce size. In original production, the Headless Horseman was played by Brom Bones. A separate actor may play the part.

PLAYING TIME: 25-30 minutes.

COSTUMES: Nineteenth century dress. The men should wear knickers (or pants rolled up), white socks, vests, pale shirts, with a sport coat pinned back to form tails. Tri-cornered hats for townsmen and perhaps a pilgrim or other unusual hat for Icabod. Women should wear long dresses, mobcaps, and shawls around the shoulders, tied just below the neck. Children should wear typical clothes: boys, plaid or plain shirts and knickers with white socks; girls, shorter dresses with bows in their hair. Black robe for Headless Horseman.

PROPERTIES: Four or five benches (simple, light, roughhewn look), a small table for Icabod's desk, a schoolbell, six slates with chalk, a switch, two large boxes covered with cloth, paper (for airplanes), notebook (for poetry), sword, rope, signs reading "Dracula," "Guts," and a drawing of a "happy face," a note (invitation to party), bowls of fruit and other "food" for party, flowers or other decorations for party, tree branches sprayed white to catch the light, jack-o-lantern with light.

LIGHTING: Lights dim, flash as indicated (a strobe is effective).

SOUND: Nineteenth century dance music (optional) where indicated. Spooky music (optional) where indicated.

AT RISE: 1 MAYOR HORACE enters from Left, carrying a bench. 2 Each TOWNSPERSON also brings in bench on his or her line. 3 All benches are placed before the schoolhouse to form the 4 classroom. 5 HORACE: Welcome, good friends, to Sleepy Hollow! As 6 Mayor of this tiny settlement, I invite you to sit a spell, 7 take refreshment, and enjoy! (Sits on bench.) (Calling from Off Right) Horace! 8 MINNIE: 9 HORACE: (Jumping up) Ah, my good wife! MINNIE: (Entering Right) An old woman ought not break her 10 back carrying furniture about. (HORACE takes her bench.) 11 12 (Entering from Left) Sleepy Hollow is much like towns 13 in the rest of the world. 14 FRANZ: (Enter Right) A peaceable place to settle, noted for 15 our fine crops. CONSTABLE: Our linens and lace are the best in all New 16 17 York. DAME: And our furniture is sought by those of good taste 18 19 throughout these new United States. **MINNIE:** (Knowingly) **But**—! 20 Minnie, not a word more. 21 HORACE: 22 CONSTABLE: It's not good for business! 23 GIDDY: Let her tell! We're fools to think they don't know 24 already. 25 MINNIE: That's right! Sleepy Hollow is most famous for our ghost! (Schoolbell rings. The CHILDREN enter happily from 26 27 Left and Right. FRANZ and CONSTABLE exit.) 28 HORACE: The new schoolmaster arrives! (He exits.) 29 **MINNIE:** (Adoringly) Master Icabod Crane. (Exit) 30 **DAME:** A dandy and a gentleman! (Exit) 31 GIDDY: (To ICABOD, who enters.) Good morning, Master Crane! 32 ICABOD: (Grandly) Why, Dame Gripper! You're charming as a plate of roast pork stuffed with apples. Shall I see you 33 34 at choir practice tonight? **GIDDY:** (Giggling) **Oh, yes! I wouldn't miss it!** (She runs off Right.)

- 1 ICABOD: (Picking up his switch) All right, students! (The
- 2 CHILDREN ignore him.) Students! (He cracks stick.) Good
- 3 morning.
- 4 CHILDREN: (In unison) Good morning, Master Crane.
- 5 ICABOD: (Each CHILD answering) Jon? Martha? Henrietta?
- 6 Claude? Gretel? Hans? (There is no answer.) Where is Hans?
- 7 GRETEL: (Frightened) He...he stopped to feed Herr 8 Gripper's goat.
- 9 ICABOD: (Furiously) Stopped to feed a goat?! (HANS runs on
- 10 from Right.) Well, the deliquent Master Hans! What have
- 11 you to say?
- 12 HANS: (Terrified) Herr Gripper's goat blocked my way. I
- 13 couldn't get around him nohow.
- 14 ICABOD: Anyhow!
- 15 HANS: (Pleadingly) No how, neither!
- 16 ICABOD: Then how did you get here?
- 17 HANS: I had to feed the goat!
- 18 ICABOD: And what did you feed it?
- 19 HANS: (Sheepishly) My homework.
- 20 ICABOD: Tardy? No homework?! Over the bench! (HANS
- 21 tiredly flops over bench. ICABOD is about to spank him when
- 22 BERTHA and TILLY enter from Left, carrying a large box,
- 23 neatly covered.)
- 24 BERTHA: Master Crane?
- 25 ICABOD: Why, the Sisters Van Ripper.
- 26 TILLY: You forgot your lunch.
- 27 ICABOD: Why, I can't imagine two more thoughtful land-
- 28 ladies.
- 29 BERTHA: It's just what you like: a roast turkey, two cornish
- 30 hens, a potato pie ...
- 31 TILLY: Cheese bread, gooseberry pie, and a pint of ale.
- 32 ICABOD: That ought to hold me 'til supper.
- 33 BERTHA: We also have news for you, Master Crane.
- 34 TILLY: (Ominously) Since you must walk the lonely road from
- 35 the schoolhouse.

- 1 BERTHA: He was spotted last night.
- 2 ICABOD: Who was spotted?
- 3 JON: (Excitedly) The Headless Horseman, of course!
- 4 ICABOD: (Terror-struck) Headless?
- 5 MARTHA: (Thrilled) He's terribly wicked!
- 6 HENRIETTA: He got his head shot off in the Revolution. A cannonball hit it just like this! (She mimics the horrible death.)
- 8 ICABOD: (Weakly) I don't believe it!
- 9 BERTHA: (Aghast) It's true as we're standing here, Master 10 Crane.
- 11 CLAUDE: He wanders around Sleepy Hollow looking for his head.
- 13 GRETEL: And anybody who crosses his path —
- 14 HANS: (With finality) He sees to it they don't come back to tell!
- 15 ICABOD: (Nervously) Well, local folklore is so charming around here.
- 17 BERTHA: (Ominously) We told you for your own sake.
- 18 TILLY: And for the sake of the children! Beware!
- 19 ICABOD: Thank you, good ladies! (TILLY and BERTHA exit 20 Right.)
- 21 JON: Can we go out and look for him?
- 22 ICABOD: Waste time on silly nonsense?
- 23 CLAUDE: My grandfather saw him!
- 24 MARTHA: He holds his head in his hands!
- 25 GRETEL: But he can see as good as any of us!
- 26 ICABOD: Children! Back to work! Now . . . where was I?
- 27 HANS: (Quickly, the model student) The history lesson, sir!
- 28 ICABOD: Why, yes...of course. Yesterday we spoke of
- 29 Cleopatra sailing down the Nile . . . when she arrived at
- 30 the Delta she met Julius Caesar and there they plotted
- 31 to take over the world! (MINNIE enters.)
- 32 MINNIE: (Walking across the stage) In the interest of preserving
- 33 your sanity, we jump ahead several centuries of ancient
- 34 **history.** (CHILDREN are bored; they throw airplanes.)
- 35 ICABOD: And there Cleopatra died...a tragic end to her

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
